The Alarmed overwhelmingly believe that taking national action to reduce global warming will provide a better life for our children and grandchildren, save plants and animals from extinction, improve people's health, and create a stronger economy. Most say that elected officials, corporations, and individuals should be doing much more to address it.

In the United States, the Alarmed tend to be moderate-to-liberal Democrats who are active in their communities. Demographically they come from every segment of society, but are more likely than average to be women, middle-aged, college-educated, and upper income.
